Welcome to our Grayling Zones in Norway

Flyfishing after grayling in our «Grayling Zones» have long traditions. Already at the end of the 20th century known flyfishers like GEM Skues started to arrive in our area. Now almost 100 years later our area is well known and people from all over Europe are visiting and fishing our “Grayling Zones”, the reason for this is probably our good fishing and picturesque nature.

In our areas there are several “Grayling zones” with stricter regulations as C&R, baglimit and other restrictions to make our fishing better. After the implementation of these restrictions we clearly see an improvement in the fishstock with an increasing number of trophy fish. Several of our areas can offer grayling of 50 cm and more and some are pushing over 60 cm. The Norwegian record for the biggest grayling caught is from our area.

The different Grayling zones complement each other, you will find Zones from small to big rivers and from 200 – 800 metres above sea level. This makes the diversity complete and scatter the hatching over a longer period. Our prime season starts in the end of May with the early signs of the small mayflies which are released with the arrival of the caddis hatches. Throughout the fall until the snow arrives you can experience second generation mayfly hatches. When you sum up all these factors you can experience splendid fishing from spring to fall. If you haven’t tried it, our fall fishing throughout September offer clear crisp mornings with beautiful fall colors and crystal clear waters. Most of our fishing is walk and wade fishing, but fishing from a boat or the use of belly boats are offered some places. The usual fly fishing techniques used in our area is dry fly fishing, but you should also be prepared to go down deep with heavy nymphs using strike indicators or with the Czech nymphing technique. Preferred equipment is a 9’ rod with a floating 3-5 weight.
