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The Borgun is a large slow flowing and crystal clear trout river that snakes through a mixture of majestic mountains and farmland, with many unique places of historic and cultural interest. Best known for dry fly fishing in its purist form, delicately presenting imitations up-stream to large wild rising trout.



Smithseter - Galten and river Femund.

Steeped in fly fishing history and tradition, started by the Smith brothers from London, who first came to here to fish at the turn of the century and quickly recognized its excellent sport. Situated just a few hundred meters from Galthue, the river that runs out of lake Galtsjøen, that is widely regarded as the systems best stretches for fly fishing.



Gjerfloen Fly fishing

Like a glittering jewel the Trysil river flows through Trysils majestic wilderness. On the Gjerfloen stretch the river flows through slow stretches that are broken by fine riffles and channels offering a varied fishing for grayling, trout and whitefish. Early in the summer the main attraction is the fantastic hatches of Danica.



The Hol, another classic dry fly river that is well known for its lengthy and prolific mayfly hatches. Sight fishing and stalking rising trout with long delicate casts are the tactics here. The best fishing is from the first half of July through to the end of the season. The chances of coming in contact with big wild brown trout are better here than in most other Norwegian rivers!



The Hemsil is one of Norway's most renowned trout rivers! The crystal clear water of the Hemsil makes for challenging fishing, but with a little skill and perseverance you can be rewarded with spectacular trophy brown trout. Experienced Local guides with a intimate knowledge of the river and its trout, will be happy to share with you the key to dry fly success.



Telstad Grayling lodge, is situated a stones throw from the upper stretches of Norway's largest river. Offering first class grayling fishing. Diverse hatches throughout the whole season on the river Glomma provides excellent dry fly and small nymph sport. Here the chances are high of connecting with trophy grayling.





Galten Gård is encompassed by stunning scenery and varied fishing, including four fly only zones on the Femund river system connected to a lake. The shallow and extremely productive lake holds an impressive amount of grayling, trout and whitefish. During hatches the fish journey from the lake to the river to feed, where you can experience outstanding dry fly fishing.



The Rena is probably Norway's most famous river for fly fishing for trout and grayling. Known for its big fish, picturesque and varying stretches and prolific mayfly hatches throughout the season, when big trout and grayling rise freely side by side.



Vestsjøberget fly fishing, Covers an extremely varied stretch of the river Trysil that flows through a typical Norwegian forest landscape. Long still flowing sections ideal for classic dry fly fishing and faster riffles that are quintessential Czech nymph stretches. The river Trysil has an extremely rich insect life, the highlight being the huge Danica hatches.





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
